CSH Overview

Central State Hospital, Georgia’s first public psychiatric hospital, was founded in 1842 to provide a safe and humane environment for Georgians with mental illness and mental retardation. Located in Milledgeville, Georgia, the CSH complex currently encompasses about 1,750 acres.

In the 1960’s, the hospital population grew to over 13,000. It was like a small city with over 100 buildings, including support facilities such as fire and police departments, school programs, recreation facilities, warehouses, maintenance shops, laundry and a steam plant. Within a decade, the population began to decrease due to the addition of other regional, public psychiatric hospitals throughout the state, an increase in community mental health programs, the availability of psychotropic medications and many individuals moving to community living arrangements.

Today, CSH serves approximately 1125 clients and averages a daily census of 800 within its three client care divisions. The hospital serves a 23 county area in Central Georgia and has specialty programs serving citizens from the entire state of Georgia.

The hospital is the 2nd largest employer in Central Georgia with 2,356 full-time equivalent employees.

CSH is operated by the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Addictive Diseases within the Department of Human Resources. The hospital is fully accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO).

Client Care Divisions

Developmental Disabilities Services

Operates four licensed nursing homes and one skilled nursing facility. The Education & Work Activities Center, the Program Services Center and Gamma House provide off unit programming for the clients, consisting of state mandated education, sheltered workshops, Central Care Homes and other vocational and developmental programs.

Psychiatric Services & Forensic Services

A maximum and medium security facility serving those persons who are found to be incompetent to stand trial, not guilty by reason of insanity, and other types of court related admissions. They also serve inmates of the Georgia Department of Corrections and certain high risk clients who are under civil commitment.

Provides inpatient evaluation, stabilization, and treatment for psychiatrically disabled adults, children and adolescents. This division also provides skilled and intermediate care for adults.

Central Care Homes

Provides cost-effective alternatives to institutionalization and opportunities for the individuals served to develop and realize new levels of independence, responsibility and community involvement. The homes also expand the available options for individuals and their families and enhance the efforts of Central State Hospital and the state of Georgia. Currently homes serve individuals with developmental disabilities or mental illness.
