SUBJECT: **UTILIZATION OF MIDDLE GEORGIA CORRECTIONAL COMPLEX
INMATES**

The wardens of the Middle Georgia Correctional Complex have agreed to provide inmates to Central State Hospital (CSH) as a supplement to the hospital's personnel for performing various work assignments in certain designated areas. This practice of supplementing personnel will be based upon the availability of inmates, availability of adequate supervision and assignment to meaningful tasks. In no case will an inmate be assigned to a duty that is considered dangerous, harmful to one's health or reflects a degrading posture. Inmates shall be initially trained according to the nature of their assigned duties and given periodic training thereafter to ensure that skills are maintained. Also, inmates will not be used to perform any tasks that are within the capabilities of the using organization.

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is designated as the single person to contact for coordinating with the Middle Georgia Correctional Complex on the utilization of inmates.
